¹ **The two legal systems** is one of the most prominent and disturbing characteristics of the Israeli military rule and the settlement enterprise in the West Bank. Whereby Jewish settlers are granted the rights and liberties guaranteed in Israel's democratic legal system, Palestinians are subject to military laws which severely limit their rights and liberties.

In 2010, The Association for Civil Rights in Israel (ACRI) and fellow organizations petitioned the High Court of Justice (HCJ 4057/10) against the lengthy and discriminatory detention periods suffered by Palestinians living in the West Bank.

This table is as unofficial translation to English prepared by ACRI of a table in Hebrew that was included in the response of the State and the military to the High Court of Justice and submitted in March 2017.

The suggested amendments included in the table were put forth by the State and military and are due to be implemented starting May 2018.
